The arts teach children to make good judgments about qualitative relationships.



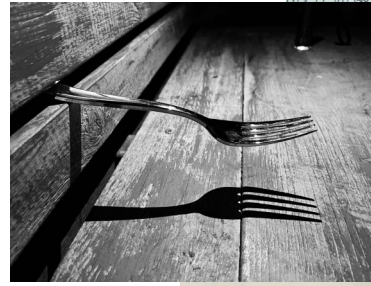
The arts can use language as a medium to emphasize and explore deep conceptual ideas.
